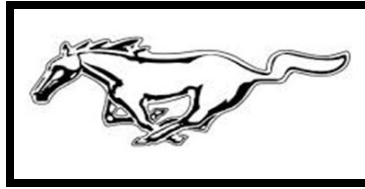


School 25 Newsletter - September 2016

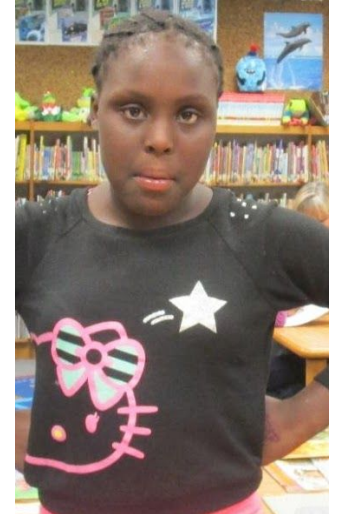
Two new students
